Bug club is an online reading programme that we at Newhall are using to support the teaching of reading. It has carefully graded texts that match to the individual level of your child, which they will be able to access at home, providing you have internet connection.

We are using these eBooks to promote a love of reading and to encourage all of our children to pick up a book for pleasure. As well as the books there are quiz activities matched to the texts which allow the children to gain coins to spend in the virtual fun area.

Texts are allocated to pupils from their class teacher and monitored on a regular basis, these texts are not to replace reading books sent home but to support. They also come with some parental guidance for when you are reading with your child. Please encourage your child to access their books and join in with the fun they will have whilst reading!
