MEET THE CREATURES SCIENCE DAY at MERE GREEN SCHOOL

On Wednesday 21st January 2015 Mrs Lucas took a group of five Year 6 pupils from New Hall to a Science Day at Mere Green School. We looked at some worksheets and had to decide what creature it was describing by the, description, habitat, colouring and foods. This got the pupils interacting and discussing all sorts of possibilities. Then the organiser, placed a range of creatures on the tables, in boxes so the pupils could see them and check if they had chosen the correct creature to the description they had been talking about.

The children were amazed and bewildered! The creatures they were looking at, later to be held if they



wanted to were a range of animals they had not seen face to face before. These included: giant snails, a bearded dragon, leopard gecko, a variety of snakes and a tarantula. The pupils had a great time looking, touching and drawing these creatures.

After lunch, the children learned about the creatures eating habits and where they lived, their special features and how they moved. They had great fun mimicking the creatures movements.

At the end of the session all the children had the chance to have their photograph taken with their favourite creature there. It was a great end to a wonderful experience that I believe will stay with the pupils for a long, long time.
