Our school improvement targets for 2015-16:

We are tremendously proud of how well New Hall pupils achieved in Y2 and Y6 SATS. We have managed to increase the percentage of children achieving higher levels (and therefore above national averages) in both K5 1 and KS2.

As parents are aware September 2014 saw a new curriculum put in place for schools to follow. At New Hall we work extremely hard to make learning interactive, fun and focussed, and our parent webs clearly explain what the children will be doing in their topics, and what you can do to help them.

This year our school focus will be on how we assess children, as that too has changed. National curriculum levels no longer exist, and there will be a new way of assessing how well pupils are doing. As a result, school priorities for this year are -

- To ensure all children consistently achieve high-quality learning across the curriculum, driven by high-quality teaching.
- To implement the use of Classroom Monitor to document assessment accurately and reflect new curriculum.

 To ensure that planning is a working document informed by assessment that is time effective and accessible for pupils in developing learning.

Dear Parent / Guardian / Driver

It has once again come to our attention that vehicles are being parked with little or no consideration for children's safety or the safety of other road users at the beginning and end of the school day. We have also had reports of resident's driveways being obstructed.

We do realise that parking can be difficult but the safety of others must be first and foremost in our minds.

Working in partnership with Traffic Wardens we will be taking a zero tolerance approach to this problem and tickets will be issued to vehicles parked illegally or without due care and attention to other road users and pedestrians.

Registrations will be evidentially noted and any violation of parking regulations may result in criminal proceedings being taken against you.

The following must be adhered to by all persons:-

- * No parking under any circumstances on yellow zig zag markings outside the front entrance
- *No parking on double yellow lines
- * No parking within 10 metres of a junction, therefore obscuring visibility
- * No parking on any grass verges. Tyres are causing damage to the verges turning up the grass.
- * No parking on any pavement areas. Persons with pushchairs, wheelchairs and disabilities require access at all times.
- * No causing any obstruction to access of resident's driveways
- * No causing any obstruction to flow of traffic

Failure to comply with any of the above will result in a fixed penalty notice being issued.
