Welcome back to the second half of the spring term. I hope you were able to spend some family time together. If you have been collecting your children you will have noticed that once again we have been making fantastic improvements to our school site. You will know, as parents, that we benefit from a huge outdoor space here at New Hall and we continually want the children to be using our outdoor areas for their learning. We have had artificial turf fitted around both the pagoda and wooden play house so that children will not be coming home with muddy shoes from playing around this area. We have also had a new 'log cabin' installed in the key stage 1 area to provide additional teaching space for small groups. One big area of development has been in Early Years where the whole of the outdoor area has been redesigned to ensure that learning outside can be accessed as often as possible. We have also now completed the outdoor maths area. We hope that the children will come home excited to tell you about what they have been doing in these new areas.

Can I also request that during collection times, that you, as parents, do not allow the children, or their younger siblings to 'play' on this equipment. Often it will be set up for the next day and we cannot accept any responsibility if you choose to allow this. In times of ever changing cutbacks to school budgets, we want this equipment to last, and it may be damaged unintentionally if children are not supervised. Whitemoor Lakes

In an assembly to the whole school, he shared with us how making poor choices as you grow older can have severe consequences. Later in the day he worked with Year 4 and 5; showing them inside a life size replica of a prison cell and giving them inside knowledge on the day to day life of young prisoners. Pupils used this experience to consider how they saw their future in a much more positive light and they are keen to follow the law to be able to achieve their aspirations!
