<u>Lunchtimes</u>

We are seeing an increasing number of children (even in Key Stage 2) who are using just a fork to eat their hot lunches. This then results in them asking lunchtime supervisors to cut up their food for them, as they do not seem to know how to use a knife properly. Whilst we appreciate that we all live in a 'fast food' world, table manners are a life skill that needs to be encouraged. Can we ask that where possible, children are encouraged to use a knife and fork when eating at home, as that is our expectation within school.



Lunchboxes

We are also seeing an increase in items like chocolate and sweets in pupils' lunchboxes. Again this is not something that we

encourage at New Hall. Pupils will be told to take these items home again. This is also the reason that we ask pupils to take ALL

contents of their lunchbox home, so that parents can see what has been eaten. Again, we are finding some pupils who are not eating their sandwiches and putting them in the food waste.
