English

Reading—Children will analyse a range of chapters from our class text 'The Firework Maker's Daughter' discussing in depth and completing challenges around the topic.

Writing—Children will spend the first few weeks on apostrophes and conjunctions and practice applying them to short burst writing. After that, they will complete their first fictional unit based on our class text 'The Firework-Maker's Daughter'.

Spelling/Phonics- Children will learn some common homophones and a range of prefixes.

Maths

Place Value

Children will explore the value of each place value column up to 10,000, and partition, compare and order numbers. They will also look at Roman numerals and rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

Addition and Subtraction

Children will learn a range of strategies to add and subtract up to two four-digit numbers. They will also evaluate the most efficient methods and begin to estimate.

Science

Living Things.

The children will learn about the different types of animal groups and be able to classify them into those groups. We also look at animal homes and how humans can damage animal habitats.
