English

Reading: Children will read a fiction, non-fiction and poetry to consolidate their phonic knowledge and build their fluency. They will read daily, either as a class, group, pair or individually.

Writing: Children will develop their fluency with regular dictation. They will be writing to inform their reader by producing a survival guide. They will be focusing on using expanded noun phrases and contractions effectively.

Spelling: Children will consolidate alternative ways to spell words with digraphs and trigraphs. They will learn how to use the possessive apostrophe and how to spell using the suffixes -ful and -less.

Maths

Addition and Subtraction: Children will build upon last half term and continue to look at addition and subtraction with two 2-digit numbers.

Shape: Children will recognise 2-D and 3-D shapes looking at vertices, edges and symmetry.

Science

Materials: Children will use their knowledge about materials to develop their working scientifically skills of asking simple questions to investigate. They will then suggest answers to questions by observing, gathering and recording data.

This half term we will be learning about...

PSHE

Celebrating Difference: Children understand that is ok to be unique and celebrate their differences.

History

How was school different in the past?

Art and Design
