English

Reading: Children will read a fiction, non-fiction and poetry text to consolidate their phonic knowledge and build their fluency. They will read daily, either as a class, group, pair or individually.

Writing: Children will develop their fluency with regular dictation. They will be writing to instruct their reader how to support their local community. They will be focusing on using commas in a list and possessive apostrophes effectively.

Spelling: Children will learn how to spell words ending with el/le/il/al. They will learn how root words change when adding suffixes, eg dizzy to dizziest, cry to cried, pat to patted.

Maths

Money: Children will build on their real life experience of money, counting in pence and pounds, compare amounts of money and solve calculations.

Multiplication and division: Children will recognise equal groups, use arrays and explore the 2, 5 and 10 times table.

Science

Animals, including humans: Children will be able to describe the basic needs of animals for survival. They will notice that animals have offspring that grow into adults and know what humans need to be healthy.

Year Two Curriculum

Overview Spring 1

This half term we will be learning about...

PSHE

Dreams and Goals: Children will discuss how to achieve a realistic goal. They will learn how to work well in a group to create an end product.

Geography

Why is our world wonderful?

Children will learn about the world's wonders, the names and locations of the world's oceans and consider what is unique about their local area.

Design Technology

Mechanisms: Fairground Wheel

Children will be designing and creating a functional fairground wheel so that the wheel rotates and the structure stands freely. Children will name parts of the mechanism.
