English

Reading: Children will read a fiction, non-fiction and poetry text to consolidate their phonic knowledge and build their fluency. They will read daily, either as a class, group, pair or individually.

Writing: Children will develop their fluency with regular dictation. They will be writing to narrate a story about a day in their life that tells the reader more about themselves. They will be focusing on joining their ideas with co-ordinating and subordinating conjunctions and using learnt Y2 punctuation.

Spelling: Children will learn how to spell words ending with tion, eg station, operation, and explore words where s is pronounced as z, eg television, vision.

Maths

Time: Children will learn to tell the time using analogue and digital clocks. They will learn o'clock, half past, quarter past and to as well as telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes.

Statistics: Children will learn about tally charts, tables and how to draw and interpret a pictogram.

Science

Mini Worlds: Children will .deepen their understanding of food chains and continue working scientifically with plants, observing closely and recording findings using simple scientific vocabulary. Children will learn about different plant habitats.

This half term we will be learning about...

PSHE
