English

Reading—Children will read a range of texts whilst continuing to develop their comprehension strategies. Group reading will take place weekly, as well as opportunities to use echo, choral, paired and whole class reading, with a focus on reading fluency.

Writing—Children will begin the half-term by studying a story called 'The Girl who Became a Fish', producing their own narrative about becoming an animal. The children will then explore a poem called 'I Am Every Good Thing' and will write their own poem describing themselves, ready to be passed on to their new teacher.

Spelling/Phonics-Our spelling sessions this half term will focus on revising the challenge words we have come across during our time in Year 3.

Maths

Time—Children will build on their prior knowledge and developed their time telling skills through learning how to use a digitial clock and solve problems with time.

Shape—Children will learn about angles and different lines including parallel lines and perpendicular lines. From this, they will learn how to draw shapes accurately.

Statistics — Children will learn how to read and analyse data from pictograms and bar charts.

Science

Working Scientifically— After finishing the final sessions of our Mirror Mirror topic from Summer I, the children will be conducting a range of experiments and investigations to try and answer scientific questions.

This half term we will be learning about...

PSHE

Changing Me-Children will explore how human's bodies change internally and externally as they go through the stages of life-from babies to children, to teenagers and finally to adults.

Geography
