

## English

**Reading:** Children will read a fiction, non-fiction and poetry to consolidate their phonic knowledge and build their fluency. They will read daily, either as a class, group, pair or individually.

**Writing:** Children will develop their fluency with regular dictation. They will be writing to inform their reader by producing a survival guide. They will be focusing on using expanded noun phrases and contractions effectively.

**Spelling:** Children will consolidate alternative ways to spell words with er, ow, or, ear sounds. They will learn how to use the possessive apostrophe and how to spell using the suffixes -ful and -less.

## Maths

**Addition and Subtraction:** Children will build up on last half term and continue to look at addition and subtraction with two 2-digit numbers.

**Shape:** Children will recognise 2-D and 3-D shapes looking at vertices, edges and symmetry.

## Science

**Forces and space:** Seasonal changes-Children will develop their understanding of the four seasons, record data about the temperature across the four seasons and label a map of the UK with capital cities and seasonal weather symbols. When working scientifically children will use pictograms.

## PSHE

**Celebrating Difference:** Children understand that is ok to be unique and celebrate their differences.

## Geography

### Where am I?

Children will identify the countries in the UK on a map, identify features within the school grounds, recognise features in aerial photographs and add symbols to a map.

## Design and Technology

### Cooking and nutrition: Balanced diet

Children will name the main food groups, chop and grate to prepare food and design and create a healthy wrap.

## PE

**Gymnastics:** They will develop gymnastic skills of jumping, rolling and balancing. They will travel individually and combine movements to create a short sequence.

## RE
