

English

Reading & Phonics—This term we will introduce split digraphs and alternative versions of the digraphs we have learnt so far. In our reading lessons we will continue to read texts that match and stretch our ability. We will have a new book each week that will progress our decoding and comprehension skills.

Writing & Spelling—We will continue to use our phonics to support our spelling. In writing our focus will be on handwriting, finger spaces, capital letters and full stops. Children will write both dictated sentences and their own independent sentences.

Maths

We will continue to practice number formation and rapid recall of number bonds. We will use our place value, addition and subtraction skills to work with numbers up to 20.

We will also be completing the Mastering Number programme that helps us build our number fluency.

Science

Living Things: Habitats—Children will develop their knowledge of life processes understanding why something is classified as alive. They will match animals and plants to their habitats and use arrows to show the order of a food chain.

Year One Curriculum

Overview Spring 1

This half term we will be learning...

PSHE

In PSHE, we will begin to explore our dreams and goals. We will look at how to achieve our goals as well as what to do when we face obstacles.

Geography

Would you prefer to live in a hot or cold place?

Children will name and identify the continents on a map. Learn about the human and physical similarities and differences between the Poles and countries near the equator. They will also compare these places to the UK.

Art

Art during this half term will focus on 'Woven Wonders'. We will talk about a range of art and artists and look at examples of their work. We will learn the skills of plaiting and knotting and use different materials to weave through paper and a box loom.

PE

Dance: Children will explore how their body can move to express mood, character and feeling. They will travel, exploring levels, shapes, directions and speed to the count of 8 beats.

RE

Creating unity and harmony: Children will discover what believers of different religions learn about getting on with others.

Music

Children will learn to sing, hum, whistle and whisper a melody. They will listen and appraise the mood of different music.

Computing

Self-image and identity: Children will learn that people may look and act differently online and know to speak up if they feel worried.
