

English

Reading: Children will read a fiction, non-fiction and poetry to consolidate their phonic knowledge and build their fluency. They will read daily, either as a class, group, pair or individually.

Writing: Children will develop their fluency with regular dictation. They will be writing to entertain their reader with an adventure story. They will be focusing on using expanded noun phrases, exclamation marks and joining two ideas with conjunctions such as and, because.

Spelling: Children will consolidate alternative ways to spell words with long vowel sounds and words ending with e/l/le/il/al. They will learn how root words change when adding suffixes, eg cry to cried, pat to patted.

Maths

Money: Children will build on their real life experience of money, counting in pence and pounds, compare amounts of money and solve calculations.

Multiplication and division: Children will recognise equal groups, use arrays and explore the 2, 5

Science

Living Things: Habitats-Children will develop their knowledge of life processes understanding why something is classified as alive. They will match animals and plants to their habitats and use arrows to show the order of a food chain.

Year Two Curriculum

Overview Spring 1

This half term we will be learning about...

PSHE

In PSHE, we will begin to explore our dreams and goals. We will look at how to achieve our goals as well as what to do when we face obstacles.

Geography

Would you prefer to live in a hot or cold place?

Children will name and identify the continents on a map., Learn about the human and physical similarities and differences between the Poles and countries near the equator. They will also compare these places to the UK.

Art and Design

In 'Woven Wonders' we will talk about a range of art and artists and look at examples of their work. We will learn the skills of plaiting and knotting and use different materials to weave through a box loom.

PE

Dance: Children will explore how their body can move to express mood, character and feeling. They will travel, exploring levels, shapes, directions and speed to the count of 8 beats.

RE

Creating unity and harmony: Children will discover what believers of different religions learn about getting on with others.

Music

Children will learn to sing, hum, whistle and whisper a melody. They will listen and appraise the mood of different music.

Computing

Self-image and identity: Children will learn that people may look and act differently online and know to speak up if they feel worried.
