

English

Reading: Children will read a fiction, non-fiction and poetry text to consolidate their phonic knowledge and build their fluency. They will read daily, either as class, group, pair or individually.

Writing: Children will develop their fluency with regular dictation. They will be writing to instruct their reader how to look after an animal of their choice. They will be focusing on using statements, commands, exclamations and questions alongside spelling homophones correctly, eg knew and new, know and no.

Spelling: Children will learn how to spell words with alternative spellings, eg or = fall/ball, talk/walk and u = other/mother and o = want/wash and adding ment/ness.

Maths

Fractions: Children will learn to identify and find a half, a quarter and a third of shapes and amounts. They will learn about unit and non-unit fractions. Children will recognise the equivalence of a half and two quarters.

Science

Plant Growth: Children will be investigating seeds, bulbs and plants. They will recognise the conditions required for germination and healthy plant growth.

Year Two Curriculum

Overview Summer 1

This half term we will be learning about...

PSHE

Relationships: Children will discuss how to build healthy, positive relationships. They will learn how to solve friendship problems and show respect for others.

History

How was school different in the past?

Children will use a range of sources to learn about classrooms today and 100 years ago. They will make comparisons and sequence photographs chronologically.

Art and Design

Map it Out: The children will explore and create maps through various art forms including drawing, in relief and in print.

PE

Net and Wall Games: Children will develop their understanding of attacking and defending in net games. Then use and develop skills, such as throwing, catching, tracking and hitting a ball.

RE

Being attentive to the sacred, as well as the precious: Children will understand the importance of silence and explain how in worship it helps people to think and reflect in a better way.

Music

Children will use instruments to create a soundscape reflecting a topic and use symbols to record long and short sounds. Children will be able to identify which sounds are higher and lower.

Computing: Digital Literacy

Privacy and security: Children will explain how passwords can be used to protect information, accounts and devices.
